Evert B. Dyckman,

Representative from Kalamazoo county in 1847, was born at Greenbush, N.y. September 25, 1800. He had a limited eductation. He became a resident of Onondaga county, N.Y., assisted in the construction of the Oswego canal, established a boat yard, and carried on an extensive coopering business. He purchased one thousand acres of land and settled at Paw Paw, Mich., in 1838, and built the Dyckman House and a grist-mill and store. He removed to Schoolcraft in 1842. In 1853 he purchased the present site of South Haven, and built a pier, saw-mill, store, and several houses. He was engaged in important enterprises at Schoolcraft, and was also engaged in banking.
