I was doing some research last week at the Arkansas History Commission and found the following information: There's a book titled **Murder, Mayhem and Miscellaneous of Lonoke County** compiled by the Lonoke Co Museum Director, Sherill Miller. There are two volumes. She transcribed entries from the Lonoke Democrat and compiled them in books.

Vol 1 from the Lonoke Democrat 7/19/1883

Died at the residence of **Mrs McKinney** near Austin 7/15, **David Thomason**, age 29 deceased, raised near Lonoke but for a year has been living in Faulkner County. Leaves wife and three children.

(David's age doesn't quite match what I have, but is close. Not sure if this is W. F. and Susan Thomason's son David or not. My research shows that he has three children, though.)

Vol 1 from Lonoke Democrat 10/6/1927

L C Flynt, Jr died Saturday at his home. Two years, two months, seven days. Buried Wattensaw.

Vol 1 from Lonoke Democrat 12/30/1897

Mr. Hiram Glover married Miss Essie Flynt December 19th, he is the nephew of J. E. and G. M. Glover of Lonoke. The bride is the oldest daughter of Squire R.M. Flynt Cleveland Township. They will live in the Mt. Zion neighborhood.

Vol 1 from Lonoke Democrat 1/25/1877

Charles Nash has given his permission to the following parties to wed: G. W. Coyle to Mrs. R. A. Boatright, **R. M. Flynt to Miss Mildred Tomason**, J. K. Halbert to Miss J. M. Stewart.

Vol 2 Lonoke Democrat 11/8/1906

Mrs W.F. Thomason died at her home in Goodrum 10-25th. She was born near Richmond, Va. in 1823, married W.F. Thomason near Germantown, Tn., moved to Lonoke Co. before the Civil War and lived here since. She died on the place they settled when they came to Ark. Buried at Wattensaw. Three children survive. Rev. G.W. Thomason, M.L. Thomas and Mrs. R.M. Flint.

Vol 2 Lonoke Democrat 1909

Dave Thomason, who was born 9/19/1883, d. at his home in Wattensaw 9-22-1909. He was born and raised in Lonoke County near where he died. He died of cancer of the stomack. Buried Wattensaw cem.
