"SCCION I. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of twenty-one years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unfailing in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American independence, testients as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the sweral Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great British."—Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Ariell III, Section 1, adapted Innus 2, 1904.
