Newport attorney Max Bowie, Sr. dies Saturday in a local hospital

Max Owen Bowie, Sr., a well known Newport attorney, died Saturday morning at a local hospital.

Bowie had practiced law in Newport since 1952. He held various offices, including city attorney and municipal judge.

He graduated from Newport High School in 1945, then entered the Navy. He later went to Hendrix College and the University of Arkansas, where he received five degrees, including a law degree, juris doctorate and Bachelor of Arts in Music.

He was a member of Sigma Chi Fraternity and Delta Theta Phi Law Fraternity.

He was also a member of the First United Methodist Church, the Newport Rotary Club, the Jackson County Bar Association and was a U.S.Navy veteran.

He is survived by one son, Max Bowie, Jr. of Tacoma, Washington; one daughter, Ann Breckenridge, of Newport, one brother, Bobby Bowie of Little Rock, four grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral service will be held at 10 a.m., Tues at Dillinger's Funeral Home Chapel with interment at Walnut Grove Cemetery.

Visitation will be from 6 to 9 p.m. today at the funeral home.

Pallbearers will be J.T. Landrum, Dr. J.D. Ashley, Byron LaVoy and Tommy Clark. Honorary pallbearers will be the members of the Jackson County Bar Association.
